

AI in Construction Arbitration

Greenbaum Partners **Robert B. Hille** and **Steven Nudelman** will be on the faculty for a presentation on “AI in Construction Arbitration” at the New Jersey State Bar Association’s 2026 Annual Meeting and Convention. The program is scheduled for Wednesday, May 13, 2026, from 1:30pm – 3:00pm at the Borgata Hotel, Casino & Spa in Atlantic City.

Construction arbitration is inherently complex, involving extensive technical materials and expert analysis—areas where AI can improve efficiency. This program introduces commonly used AI tools in construction arbitration, explains how they support advocates and arbitrators, and explores the ethical considerations of their use, concluding with a demonstration of the American Arbitration Association’s AI Construction Arbitrator.
